

Top 6 Things That Precinct Leaders Do

Generally, Precinct Captains, Co-Captains and Youth Chairmen are leaders and trainers who should bring others into leadership positions and let them help you manage your precinct. “Kitchen Table Work Sessions” are good for training, discussing issues and planning activities. Precinct leaders should know who all the voting Republicans are in their precinct. The Kenton County Republican Party can supply you with these lists.

1. Recruit friends and neighbors to help in your precinct
 - They can help with door to door canvassing
 - Sign locations
 - Precinct Leadership
 - Voter Registration, etc....
2. Identify your local public officials and learn what they do
3. Identify quality people for office & refer them to the Candidate Recruitment Committee
4. Arrange neighborhood political meetings for candidates
5. Identify potential poll workers
6. Identify people willing to give rides to the polls on election day

Precinct Captain, Co-Captain and Youth Chairman may be ALSO called upon to:



Conduct pre-election surveys of voters



Conduct voter registration campaigns to register Republican voters



Distribute literature for the Republican Party or for candidates



Go door-to-door with and for candidates



Participate in 72 Hour Programs the weekends before elections



Line-up volunteers to serve as poll-watchers, if needed



Line-up volunteers for the Party's/Candidate's Headquarters on election days



Put up yard signs



Put on bumper/window stickers



Help in mail-out campaigns



Write letters to editors supporting candidates



Participate in rallies, fundraisers, political forums



Make “Get Out The Vote” (GOTV) phone calls before and on election day



Serve as poll workers on election day



Give rides to the polls on election day



Offer service to people in the community.
